Executive Summary

At Council's June 27, 2017 regular meeting of Council, passed a motion to direct Administration to prepare a bylaw amendment to City of Cold Lake Procedural ByLaw No. 308-BD-07 for the Chair to acknowledge the fact that the City of Cold Lake is meeting on or within Treaty 6 and Metis Territory at the outset of any meeting of the City of Cold Lake's Council (i.e. We acknowledge that we are on Treaty 6 territory, a traditional meeting grounds, gathering place, and travelling route to the Cree, Saulteaux, Blackfoot, Metis, Dene, and Nakota Sioux. We acknowledge all the many First Nations, Metis, and Inuit whose footsteps have marked these lands for centuries.).

Background

Councillor Macdonald's original notice of motion has been attached for reference purposes.

It should be recognized that this movement, in many circumstances, is relating to the federal government's movement for reconciliation with First Nations across Canada relating to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada: Calls to Action. This movement is an emerging trend that seems to have originated with the larger City's (e.g. Edmonton and Calgary), however, is not itself outlined as a specific action in the calls to action.

It is unclear to administration, how much engagement occurred with the indigenous peoples prior to implementing statements of acknowledgements such as the one presented at Council's meeting (Lakeland Catholic School Board). Without engagement, there are risks that the contents of the acknowledgements may have untended results, especially when the statement goes into greater detail in its acknowledgements. (The most recent example is the Prime Minister of Canada's 150th Day Speech; the Prime Minister left out Alberta when the naming Provinces and Territories; this omission had unintended consequences).

Based on the above, it is administration's advice to keep the statement "high level" and "all encompassing." It is a fact that the City of Cold Lake lies within the Treaty 6 area.

The current bylaw articulates (which is consistent to the Council's motion):

"We acknowledge that we are on Treaty 6 territory, a traditional meeting grounds, gathering place, and traveling route to the Cree, Saulteaux, Blackfoot, Metis, Dene, and Nokaota Sioux. We acknowledge all the many First Nations, Metis, and Inuit whose footsteps have marked these lands for centuries."

The initial notice of motion articulated:

"We acknowledge that Council is meeting on the traditional land of Treat 6 Territory, and acknowledge the diverse indigenous peoples whose ancestors' footsteps have marked this territory for centuries"

Administration must also advise that we are in receipt of correspondence from a Cold Lake First Nations councillor which asks whether a reconciliation process is something for the City of Cold Lake to consider. It may be wise to consult with First Nations and the Metis Settlements in the area prior to formally adopting a statement, if the statement is intended as a gesture of reconciliation with indigenous peoples.

Alternatives

Council may consider the following options:

- Give first reading to ByLaw No. 610-BD-17 being an amendment to Procedural ByLaw No. 308-BD-07;
- Defeat first reading to ByLaw No. 610-BD-17 being an amendment to Procedural ByLaw No. 308-BD-07;
- Subject to Council giving first reading, Council may, at its' purgative, direct Administration to schedule a non-statutory public hearing.

Recommendation

That Council give first reading to ByLaw No. 610-BD-17 being an amendment to Procedural ByLaw No. 308-BD-07.



A BYLAW OF THE CITY OF COLD LAKE, IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, TO AMEND BYLAW 308-BD-07, THE PROCEDURAL BYLAW.

WHEREAS the Council of the City of Cold Lake deems it necessary to Amend Section 4.8 Order of Business of Procedural Bylaw No. 308-BD-07;

AND WHEREAS, it is deemed expedient to amend Bylaw No. 308-BD-07 of the City of Cold Lake,

NOW THEREFORE, under the authority of the *Municipal Government Act*, Chapter M-26, Revised Statutes of Alberta 2000, as amended, the Council of the City of Cold Lake, in the Province of Alberta, duly assembled, hereby enacts as follows:

1. Add the following to Section 4.8 Order of Business to read as follows:

Prior to the commencement of any Council or City Committees, the Chair of the meeting shall acknowledge the following:

"We acknowledge that we are on Treat 6 territory, a traditional meeting grounds, gathering place, and travelling route to the Cree, Saulteaux, Blackfoot, Métis, Dene, and Nakota Sioux. We acknowledge all the many First Nations, Métis, and Inuit whose footsteps have marked these lands for centuries."

Council and City committees shall use the following order of business, unless changed by unanimous consent.

- (1) Call to Order
- (2) Adoption of Agenda
- (3) Adoption of Minutes
- (4) Question Period
- (5) Public Hearings
- (6) Delegation (limited to Council meetings)
- (7) City Financial Reports
- (8) Old Business
- (9) New Business
- (10) Committee Reports
- (11) Notices of Motion, Proclamations, or Announcements
- (12) Adjournment
- 2. This Bylaw shall take effect upon third and final reading.
