 - A trailer for inclement weather teaching / shelter in place
 - Space needs to fit maximum 12 adults
 - Equipment storage (ex. Boats, sails, life jackets, etc.)
 - Accessible beach or dock space to launch boats
 - Safe distance from other boaters
 - Away from rocky shoreline


Optimum Location





Program Details


- Certified CANSail instructors
- Skills based program versus a traditional pass/fail course
 - Meaning each course can be tailored to meet the experience and skill set of the group
 - No previous sailing experience is required for participants
- Various levels of courses are offered through the sailing season to allow students to return and build upon the skills they have developed.
- Classes will be a combination of on land theory followed by guided on water instruction and sailing exercises to practice learned skills
 - Emphasis is on hands-on experience in the boat
- Can be run in all weather conditions, with more focus given to on land instruction on foul weather days *
- *If there is available indoor teaching space




























Positive Future Benefits
