Who is Eligible

- To be eligible for PDD you must 18 years old and have a developmental disability. This means you may have had a disability from birth or one happened while you were growing up.
- Having a developmental disability means a person may need help to learn new things and assistance with day-to-day activities. A developmental disability is not the same as a physical disability, a health condition or a mental health disorder.

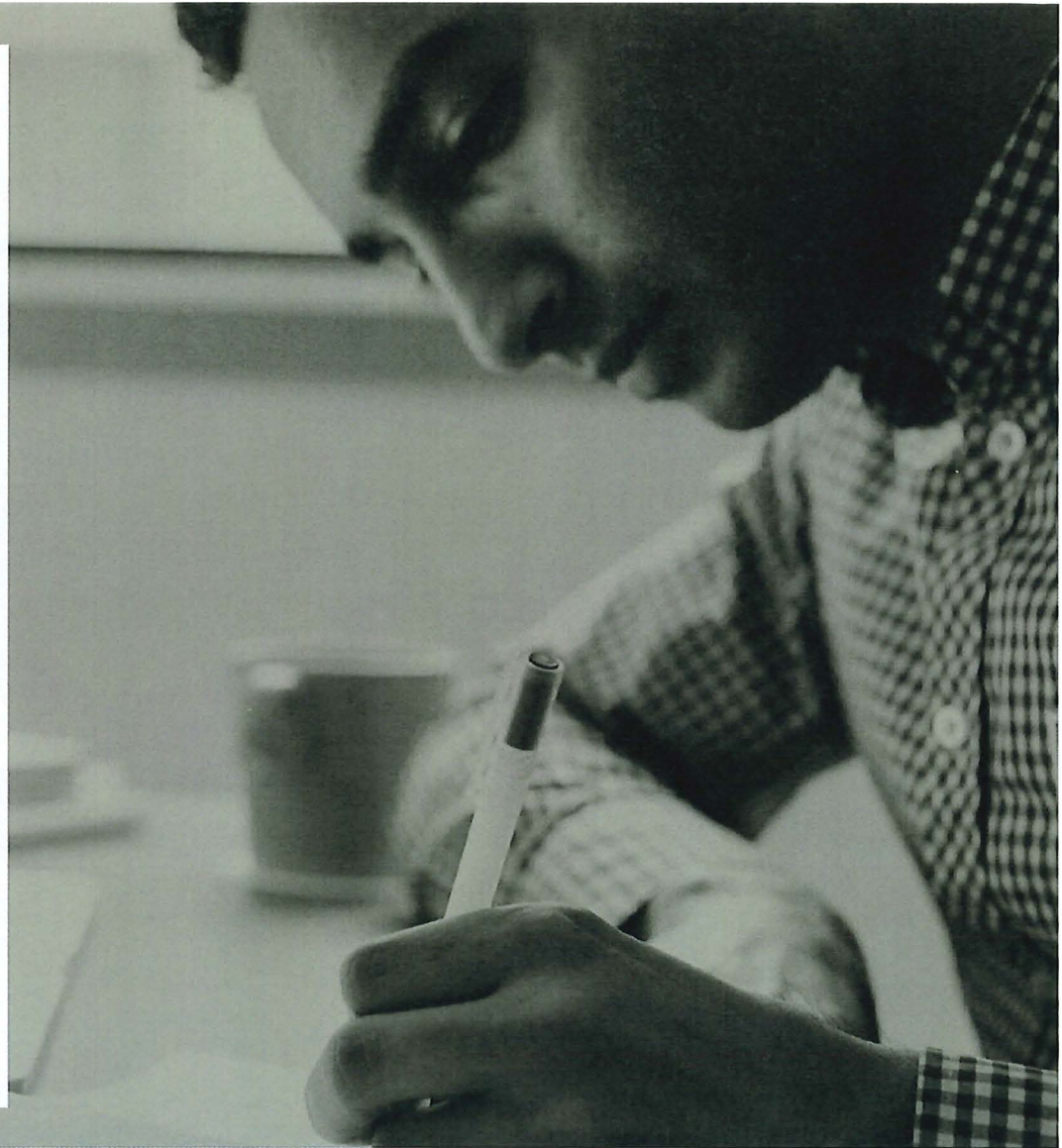

- Address employer concerns about hiring PDD eligible clientele while maintaining confidentiality
- Meet with employers, introduce individuals to employers, facilitate job discoveries or positions
