Round Table Discussion:

- There was a discussion about the influx of homeless people in the City and their displacement once the cold weather hits. There was a discussion about each workers ability to deal with threats and the different comfort levels during a heightened situation. Safety will look at updating the Summoning Assistance procedure to add some specific people to contact.
