History & Laws

- Until recently building code and Provincial Law was depended upon
- Only three provinces have a law specifically for disabilities

MORE THAN 6 MILLION CANADIANS AGED 15 AND OVER HAVE A DISABILITY




CANADIANS WITH MILDER DISABILITIES


EARN AND THOSE WITH 12% MORE SEVERE DISABILITIES



Universal Design


"the design and composition of an environment so that it can be accessed, understood and used to the greatest extent possible by all people regardless of their age, size, ability or disability"



Why now??


- Currently around 3.8 million or 1/7 live with a disability

- Inoperable doors & threshold changes
- Very few accessible washrooms





Places to Start

- Add tactile warnings and colojr contrast to edges and level changes
- Install signage where needed
- Educate staff when needed
- Add seating intermittently alongside walks
- Create more parking spaces
