CRIME PREVENTION INITIATIVES

- Conducted Eight hundred and eighty-four (884) patrols (City facilities, business locations, neighbourhoods), offered presence and liaison efforts
- Graffiti related: Eighteen (18), all proactive patrol incidents of graffiti vandalism.

SCHOOL SAFETY

- School zone safety patrols:
 - → Three (3) patrols occurred throughout the various school zones (Holy Cross, St. Dominic, and Assumption) twice a day which helped assist parking, cross walks and connections with staff, students, and public.

SOCIAL DISORDER

- Encampment: Twenty-eight (28) illegal camping related calls and Ten (10) encampment actions.
- Public Nuisance: Sixty-two (62) calls regarding unreasonable public activity.
- Downtown Presence: Two hundred and fifteen (215) proactive patrols (business fronts, alleys, etc.) leading to approximately 7 patrols per day.

- The park area in the Lakewood Estates subdivision was completed and inspected in mid-August.
- A 41-lot expansion of the Parkview Estates neighbourhood was approved by the Municipal Planning Commission on August 22nd. This is the second multi-lot subdivision approved after an 8-year hiatus between 2014 and 2022.
