Golf Course

July saw the opposite of June with many days of excessive heat temperatures and smoke from the surrounding forest fires. Due to poor air quality, our operations were affected as many guests cancelled tee times as it was too hot to play. To offset the heat, July also saw many days of rain, so it has been a double-edged sword. The Driving Range has noted theft of our Range Balls that has significantly depleted our stock and has resulted in us placing an additional order to accommodate our guests.

Pro Shop

GWC hosted 3 large Tournaments, along with 5 Private events that assisted in sales and revenue growth. July saw almost 150K in sales for the month. GWC took on an unexpected and planned event last minute for Primco Dene . The Tournament hosted 150 participants and boosted revenue at 10k for the day alone. The event went well and there is talk to host it again in 2025. The end of July resulted in us selling out the majority of our Golf Ball supply and us having to place a 2nd order in for our Guests.
