BYLAW NO. 856-LU-24
A BYLAW TO AMEND LAND USE BYLAW NO. 766-LU-23

A BYLAW OF THE CITY OF COLD LAKE, IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, TO AMEND LAND USE BYLAW NO. 766-LU-23 TO REMOVE THE RESTRICTION ON OVERNIGHT STAYS IN CHILD CARE FACILITIES.

PURSUANT to Sections 191(1), 639, 640(2), and 686(1)(a)(i)(A) of the *Municipal Government Act*, RSA 2000, Chapter M-26 as amended, a council must adopt a land use bylaw which divides the municipality into districts which prescribe the use(s) of land and buildings within said districts and where council also has the power to amend such land use bylaw;

WHEREAS the City of Cold Lake Land Use Bylaw No. 766-LU-23 defines a “Child Care Facility” to not include overnight accommodation;

WHEREAS the *Early Learning and Child Care Act*, SA 2007 Chapter E-0.1 establishes the regulations under which Child Care Facilities may operate:

WHEREAS the *Early Learning and Child Care Act*, SA 2007 Chapter E-0.1 does not restrict the operating hours of a Child Care Facility licensed under the *Act*;

WHEREAS Council wishes to remove the restriction on overnight accommodation to allow for the development of Child Care Facilities offering 24-hour care and supervision for children;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the City of Cold Lake in the Province of Alberta, in Council duly assembled, hereby enacts as follows:

SECTION 1 – TITLE

- 1.1 This Bylaw shall be cited as “Bylaw No. 856-LU-24, Amendment to Land Use Bylaw No. 766-LU-23” to amend the definition of a Child Care Facility.

SECTION 2 – AMENDMENT

- 2.1 Part E(3) of the City of Cold Lake Land Use Bylaw No.766-LU-23 is hereby amended by:
 - 2.1.1 Deleting: “Child Care Facility means a provincially regulated facility used for the provision of care, educational services, or supervision for seven (7) or more children during the day or evening without overnight accommodation. This use does not include a family day home or group home.”
 - 2.1.2 Inserting: “Child Care Facility means a provincially regulated facility used for the provision of care, educational services, or supervision for seven (7) or more children. This use does not include a family day home or group home.”

SECTION 3 – ENACTMENT

- 3.1 This Bylaw shall come into full force and effect at the beginning of the day that it is passed.
